WHEN COLIN MET JOYCE – a documentary – is about the love story of Indigenous political activist Joyce Clague and Colin, a white man who met in 1964 and have had a mixed-race marriage that has been entwined in a forty-year journey of support, nurturing, devotion, commitment and love. They are the yin and yang of each other. But it is their principles about Aboriginal welfare, social justice, humanity and family that bind them and have helped shape the Australian nation. When Colin met Joyce is a love story with a true sense of reconciliation bringing Colin's and Joyce's lives together.

THE PRAMS – a black comedy with references to Hitchcock's "The Birds" – a clash of lifestyle. Attacked by a single pram whilst walking to an inner city cafe, career focused Melanie suddenly finds herself in the centre of a frightening pram epidemic that has hit Brisbane

LULLABY – a beautiful drama – Poppy and Bella struggle to bring themselves up in a rundown warehouse space above the burlesque club where their mother sings. When Bella's fantasy of a loving mother becomes obsessive, Poppy must wrestle with how to tell her little sister the truth.
